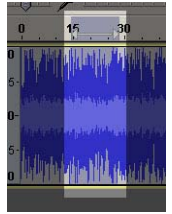


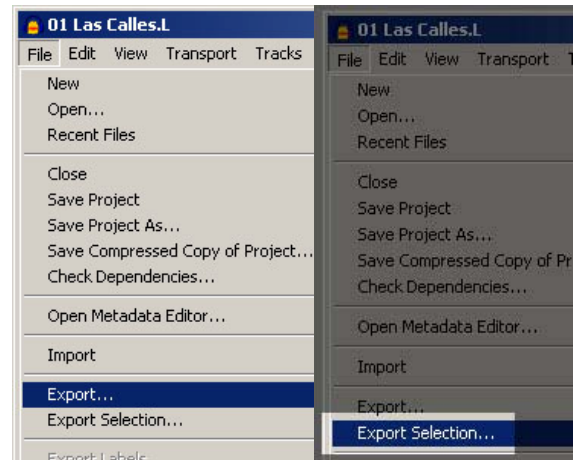
# Export Sounds out of Audacity!

**1.** First, record something into audacity so that you have something you like. Decide whether you want to export the whole sound, or just a selection.



**2a.** If you want to use all the sound from your Audacity Project, click on **File -> Export**

**2b.** If you want to just use a smaller part, or a selection from your Audacity Project, highlight just that section, and click on **File -> Export Selection**

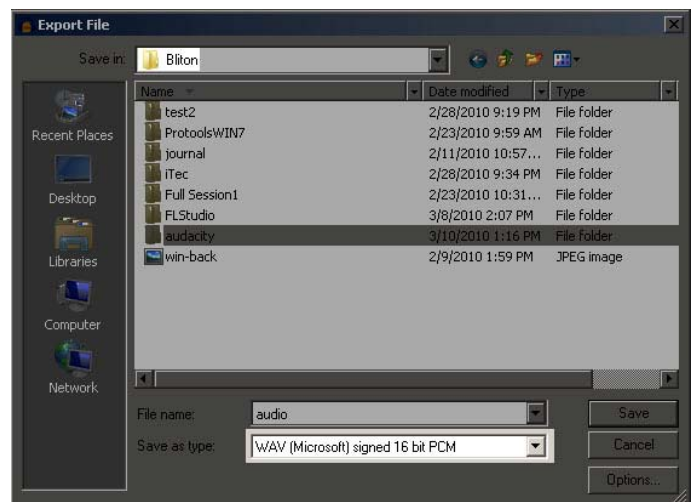


**3.** Find your folder under **My Documents**.

Then name your sound file.

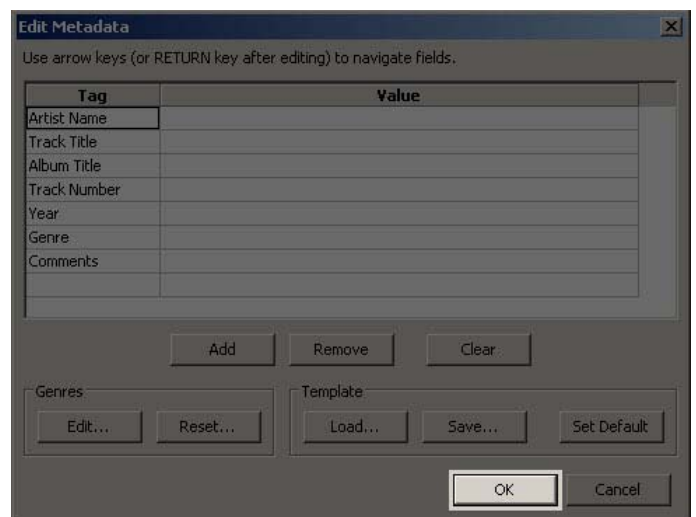
Change "Save as type:..." to "**WAV (Microsoft)...**"

Click "**Save.**"



**4.** On the next window, click "**OK**"

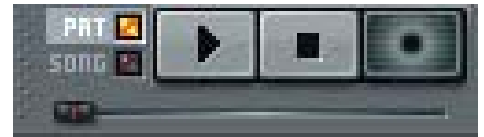
The next window, titled "**Edit Metadata**" lets you say more about your sound file. When we make **mp3** files of our Audacity projects, we can put in our **Name, Title, Album**, etc...



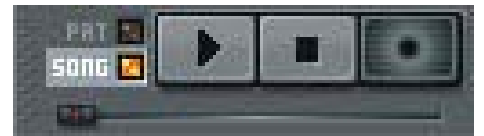
# Export Sounds out of FL Studio!

1. First, create some music. Then decide whether you want to export a single **Pattern**, or the whole **Song**.

2a. If you want to use just the sound from one **Pattern**, click "**PAT**" next to the play and stop buttons at the top of your screen.



2b. If you want to use your whole **Song**, click "**SONG**" next to the play and stop buttons at the top of your screen



3. Click "**File -> Export -> Wave file...**"

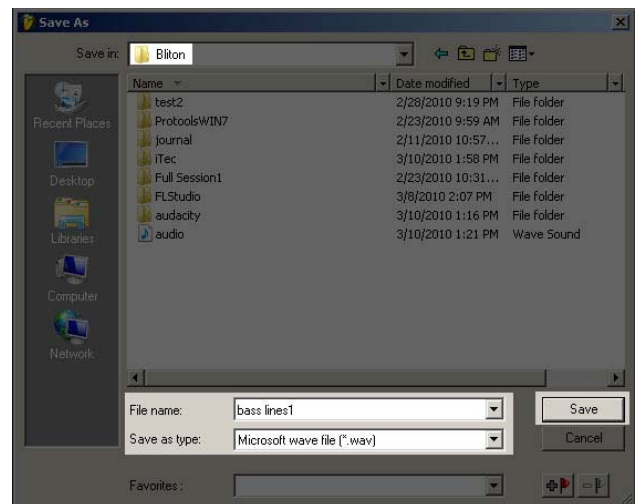
We have other options here for making different kinds of sound files. This one is best for using with your videos in Windows Movie Maker.



4. Find your folder under **My Documents**.

Then name your sound file.

Change "Save as type:..." to "**WAV (Microsoft)...**" and click "**Save.**"



5. On the next window, click "**START**" and you're done!
